COURSE GRADING POLICY: Students will be graded at multiple instances each week via class work assignments, homework assignments, guizzes, tests, application projects, and other alternative assessments (including journals and participation). Student performance will be reflected as a marking period grade four times per year, based upon the scale below.

HOMEWORK:

General Homework Information

- Practicing on your own is essential when it comes to learning mathematics; therefore, homework will be assigned on most nights. If you do not understand a problem, do not give up! Look back to your notes in order to attempt as much of the problem as possible. Use the online resources provided to you if necessary. Apply your problem-solving skills to the best of your ability (that is, think about what is known and unknown in the problem in order to discover relationships and plan strategies for solving). If you are still stuck on a problem, be sure to write the specific reasons as to why you are confused and/or specific questions you have for me about the problem. Please read all directions carefully and complete all parts of all required problems (including any "throwback" problems) in order to receive full credit.

- There will also be some online homework assignments through www.tenmarks.com, for which you will receive more information soon!

General Homework Expectations

- Check boruchmath.weebly.com every night to stay on task.

- On a daily basis, you are expected to take out your homework and homework log, "post" any problems you would like to go over, and begin checking your answers and/or answering any prompts written on the board upon entering the classroom (before the bell rings).

- Homework quizzes may also be utilized.

Homework Log

- *You will be responsible* for maintaining a homework log for each unit of study. I will mark your log with the number of points that corresponds to the thoroughness of your work, and will collect your log periodically.

Late Homework

- Homework will be accepted no more than *one day* late for partial credit, unless there are special circumstances.

*Please note that your materials will need to be replenished throughout the year (especially pencils [©]), and that you can file your work from previous units at home once a new unit is completed.

*You should also clean out your binders/folders after each unit, and keep your work organized at home to reference when studying for summative assessments.


Se Material Responsibilities
